

ISLAND 22

Architecture can be the solution to the migrant crisis that faces many western countries today.

Island 22 will serve as a marker, symbolizing a sense of arrival, home and acceptance in the heart of the St. Lawrence. The enclosed space within the domes are kept at a constant 22°C year round (average summer temperature) and are connected to one another via underground sky-lit tunnels.

Each dome consists of a:

- o Modular residential complex
- o Public pavilion
- o Organic orchard.

Two- Way Benefits:

- Migrants are given these homes to transition into the cold Canadian climate, while Montrealers can purchase them as year-round summer cottages. This intermingling of migrants and Canadians as neighbours promotes acceptance.
- All culture/health/education/government facilities are easily located in Montreal to allow the migrants to leave the island and explore the city.
- The constant warm climate allows food to be grown year round, and these organic orchards allow migrants and Montrealers alike to simply enjoy food picked right from the plant and bond through the process of farming.
